### TREASURES REPORT

Fundraising initiatives have included: Halloween Dance, Photoshoot at Christmas, Chocolate Fundraiser, Poinsettia sale, Mabel's Label's and Woodward Meats.

Total Raised to date \$23 300.36 after expenses.

Expenses have included: YFA T-shirts, two pizza invoices that were left over from last year, two teacher cheques left over from last year, bank service fees, Halloween dance-a-thon, photo shoot, money for staff, fruit baskets, bulletin board, Pancake Tuesday.

CSC has committed approximately \$11 000 for the rest of the year (see below). Any money left over is approximately \$12 000 to be spent this school year.

# 2. Principal Report

Parents requested an opportunity for junior students to have opportunity to use the volleyball courts during recess. Admin to look at possibility of rotating between junior and intermediate divisions to have access. Some primary students are using the volleyball court as a sandbox and would like to bury sticks and rocks. Nets are too high for primary students.

Mass for Ash Wednesday was a beautiful celebration. The Choir did a beautiful job and a big thanks to teachers and staff who helped organize the liturgy mass.

Rosary Apostolate continues to be a success with many students. SFA thanks the volunteers who come in to do this.

Snacks have been very popular and enjoyed by the students.

On April 1<sup>st</sup> intermediate students on the wellness team are attending a conference accompanied by Ms. Lence.

ShareLife and Spirit Week's have been raising funds for Share Life. Totals raised are being shared with students in the hallways.

May 2<sup>nd</sup>'s Spring Fling is to raise money for ShareLife.

During Holy Week April 14-18<sup>th</sup> the school will not have any after school meetings or activities as part of the board wide mandate. April 17<sup>th</sup> SFA will be hosting Stations of the Cross by the grade 8 students in the gym. The school will be receiving a pretzel. Youth Faith Ambassadors will be engaging in some activities to educate about the significance of the pretzel in the Easter Season.

June 6<sup>th</sup> is the Year End Mass at 10:15am.

Work Orders have been put in to help remediate the field and walkways due to flooding, snow and ice buildup. The board has been out to look at this situation and a request has been made to help fix the issue. Parents are thanked for their advocacy, support and patience.

Chess club is going well

Craft club has been well utilized. 66 students have signed up for this club (grade 1-3). This is in response to a request to include primary aged students. Thank you to the parent volunteers and teacher supervisors.

Tournaments for sports teams are upcoming this spring.

May 22<sup>nd</sup> is the Journey into Learning. Incoming students often get a bag of goodies. A request from CSC to provide an amount of financial support. The Dance company are coming to teach students. May 23<sup>rd</sup> will be the performance for parents during the day.

## May 26 Intermediate Softball tournament

May 26-30<sup>th</sup> Rock wall climbing being offered for students by a board vetted vendor. This has been funded through a donation the school received earmarked for athletics. More information for parents is to come.

#### June 2-6 Jr. Soccer tournament

Grade grad 8 trip is in the process of being planned. Grade 8's are considering a fundraising event to help curtail the cost of the trip. Lots of conversation at the board level about how to keep costs of graduation as low as possible.

Easter Photos are being offered by the same photography company that did classroom pictures. It costs \$10.00.

The Ministry of Education has mandated a Reading Screening in FDK - Grade 2. This is to inform programing but does not impact assessment/grades. This was used to help identify what students are not meeting benchmarks for supports can be put in place. The first screener took place in November. Those that were below or well below benchmark were rescreened on March 25, 2025. Results are pending.

Science of Reading is being used with students.

SFA is experiencing enrolment decline. It is projected that it will reduce by about 30 students.

Math: SFA's EQAO scores in grades 3 and 6 were below the board average. This provides the school with access of a Math Coach to support grade 3 and 6 classes. This coach works directly with teachers and student sin the classrooms. She comes approximately 4 days per month. She also did a lunch and learn for staff to go over resources, strategies and tools to support learners.

EQAO is happening in the spring. This important assessment occurs for students across Ontario in grade 3 and 6. It is happening May 7- June 11<sup>th</sup>. Attendance and participation are important and strongly recommended. More information will go home to families through School Messenger. This is for reading, writing and math. Accommodations are offered for students that requires them.

Placement Requests from parents regarding a certain teaching style must be in writing to the Assisi Info email box and not directly to teachers. Please refrain from requesting specific teachers as placements can change up until September.

Immunizations: Ontario Schools is partnered with Public Health. The enforcement of Immunizations of school pupils Act. This is not a school-based decision. This is mandated by the Ministry of Education. The date of suspension is April 15<sup>th</sup>. An email was sent out to families to communicate with Public Health about immunizations.

There is a \$1000 grant for a Parent Engagement Event. Administration to look at the list of external approved presenters and see if anyone is available during Catholic Education Week.

School By-laws have been updated. The number of council members has been updated to 16 which means there will be 16 parent spots available for the next council to fill to be voted in. Vote required to be approved. All in favour, no opposed. Motion carried.

Teacher Update: Some of the items teachers have purchased with their wish list money is chubby markers, drums, floating shelves and trolley for books to go from class to class, ELL games, clip boards, jumbo playing cards, timers, dice, rocks and minerals test kit.

The talent show is a Spring Sugar theme. A request is made for organic lollipops for all the students. A request made for \$150. *Motion brought forward Niamh*, seconded by Marianne. *Motion carried*.

A choir celebration is being planned to recognize students who were leaders, had good attendance, took initiative, gave suggestions. A request made for \$150 Motion brought forward Niamh, seconded by Michelle. Motion carried.
